

Dimitri Villers-Moriamé

Dimitri is one of the youngest partners, if not the youngest that our association counts among its members.

Indeed, his career, quite atypical, brought him back to France more quickly than expected; since after studying at the University of Santa Barbara in California, his diplomas in economics and Accounting in hand, Dimitri joined EY France and worked mainly on the audit of French groups listed in the US and on subsidiaries of American groups, which are all subject to SOX and PCAOB regulations. He then joined the Financial Accounting and Advisory Services (FAAS) branch to be responsible for internal audit assignments for a large French group.

After a little over 3 years in the Paris office, Dimitri returned to the United States where he joined the EY office in New York. After obtaining his CPA license, he rather quickly became an audit manager, obtaining the management of interesting files, an American listed company in the Retail sector and the US subsidiaries of a large French advertising group in particular.

After two years, he returned to Paris where he joined the Saint-Germain Audit firm.

Saint-Germain Audit is a Parisian firm created in 1986 by my father Frédéric who works in auditing and accounting. The firm now has three partners and fifteen associates. One of the peculiarities of the firm is the number of languages spoken, no less than 10 languages, including Arabic, Vietnamese and Polish. Its size also allows it to manage large mandates as well as slightly more modest mandates while keeping a real proximity with its clients and a great reactivity to their requests.
